

#### Surrounded by mountains means outdoor adventure all around

The Blue Ridge Mountains offer endless outdoor fun and adventure. The famous <u>Blue</u> <u>Ridge Parkway</u> – the most visited unit of the National Park Service – is an ideal place for a scenic drive or a relaxing bike ride. More biking is available on <u>mountain bike trails</u> around the valley or 20+ miles of continuous <u>greenway</u> along the Roanoke River. Hikers can stretch their legs on miles of trails, including the famed <u>Appalachian Trail</u>, that lead to waterfalls, mountain views or even secluded swimming holes. For water recreation, there is boating on <u>Smith Mountain Lake</u> or paddling and fishing on the many streams and rivers, including the acclaimed <u>Upper James River Water Trail</u>.





#### A unique railroad past that is always present

Once a sleepy little village called "Big Lick," Roanoke became a prosperous and bustling city with the arrival of the railroad. It's still a hub of rail activity. The influence of the railroad can be seen in many ways across the Roanoke Valley, especially in places like the <u>O. Winston Link Museum</u>, the <u>Virginia Museum of Transportation</u> and the railwalk.

## What's New?

**Center in the Square** has been a treasured part of the Roanoke Valley's cultural life for three decades. In 2013, *Center in the Square* unveiled its extraordinary \$30 million renovation. The seven-story complex, located in the heart of downtown Roanoke, now includes a butterfly habitat, two 500-gallon jellyfish aquariums and a rooftop garden with an overlook deck.
