Even though Boulder is surrounded by wilderness, mountains and natural beauty, the town is just 30 minutes from Denver and 45 minutes from Denver International Airport. And the drive is a scenic one! Your group's first impression of Boulder may well be the scenic overlook from the Boulder Turnpike from Denver, a memorable panorama, to be sure.
