Discover the District on your own artistic adventure...a scavenger hunt designed specifically for your age group that will guide you through a world of art and exploration!





Bluff View Art District Scavenger Hunt

CONDUCTOR

What if you could... be a conductor aboard a train at the Tennessee Valley Railroad Museum? Grab your engineer's cap and be an imaginary conductor for the day! Jump aboard the Tennessee Valley Railroad Museum's locomotive train and travel along Missionary Ridge.



Grab your engineer's cap and be a conductor aboard a vintage train. You'll experience one of the original rail lines into Chattanooga; witness two unique methods of turning a train around: the better known turntable, and the wye (think of doing a three-point turn with your car and you're close); and ride through the Missionary Ridge Tunnel, especially noted for its uniqueness as a horseshoe tunnel.

Missionary Ridge Local trains run daily mid-March through October and weekends only in November. Additional services offered throughout the year include Chickamauga Turn trains to Chickamauga, Georgia on summer weekends, Dixie Land Special excursions into northwest Georgia, and North Pole Limited trains during the holidays. Grand Junction Station is located near I-75, Exit 4 at the Jersey Pike exit from Highway 153.

What if you could... be an adventurer like Indiana Jones on a RockQuest scavenger hunt at Rock City Gardens, high atop


Lookout Mountain? The Enchanted Trail leads you to view more than 400 varieties of native plants and flowers. You'll trek through massive rock formations formed thousands of years ago and have the chance to be a rock climber on the 25-foot climbing wall.

Your RockQuest Guide will help you look for clues to many of the geological wonders at Rock City. You'll trek along the Enchanted Trail through massive rock formations, scale the 25-foot climbing wall, see seven states from Lover's Leap, and you may even spot a gnome.

Rock City Gardens is a true marvel of nature featuring massive ancient rock formations and panoramic views 1,700 feet above sea level. The self-guided tour along the Enchanted Trail takes you through some of the South's most spectacular natural scenery where you'll learn about sedimentary rocks, minerals, crystals and the forces of nature that created these unique rock formations.

SPELEOLOGIST

What if you could... venture underground and be a speleologist inside a deep cavern at Ruby Falls on Lookout Mountain? Learn about rocks and geology and view the cave's mysterious chambers and amazing rock formations!



What's a speleologist you ask? It's someone who studies caves, their history, structure, physical properties, and how they change over time. As you journey deep underground to Ruby Falls, use your Safari Guide to discover the answers to questions during your cave and waterfall tour. This is a recreational activity of exploring a cave, also known as caving and spelunking. You will be dazzled as your guide shares tales of folklore and history and teaches you about the rocks and geology throughout the cave's mysterious chambers.

Ruby Falls is America's deepest cave accessible to the public and has the largest underground waterfall! Show your completed Ruby Falls scavenger hunt (page 20) to the staff at the end of your tour and receive a free geode - that is cracked open for you to see inside the rock!

Show your Safari Guide to your tour guide, or ask for one before you begin your tour at the Ruby Falls ticket desk.






