

The Rosedale Arch is maintained by the Parks and Recreation Department of the Unified Government of Wyandotte County / Kansas City Kansas. It is just one of several historic sites that exist within our large park system.

Rosedale World War I Memorial Arch in Mount Marty Park was built to commemorate the service and sacrifice of the men of Rosedale who served in the Great War. The architect, John Leroy Marshall, had served in France and designed the arch as a scaled down version of Arc de Triomphe from a sketch he drew. The unique arch is 34'6" in height and 25'5" by 10'5" in width at the base. The arch opening is 10' wide and 20' tall. It is constructed of brick with a 4" limestone facing over the brick.

The arch was built in 1923-24 and placed on the National Register of Historic Places August 2, 1977. Two overlooks at the base of the arch provide commanding views to the north and east.
