The National Agricultural Center & Hall of Fame was chartered by Congress in 1960 to honor the American farmer. This unique 164-acre museum complex offers a variety of exhibits and activities for visitors of all ages!

The National Farmers Memorial serves as the nation's only monument saluting the hard working American farmer. The three high-relief bronze sculptures represent the past, the present and the future of agriculture.

The centerpiece exhibit is the Agricultural Hall of Fame. Here men and women representing diverse segments of agriculture are honored because they have made significant contributions to the advancement of agriculture.

The main building also houses the rural art gallery, a 200-seat theater and the gift shop.

Step back in time and enjoy the park-like setting of Farm Town USA; an early 1900s rural farming community complete with a farmstead, one-room school, blacksmith shop, depot and more. There is also a narrow gauge miniature train that circles around the farm town.

The Museum of Farming houses the majority of the museum's collection of historic machinery and implements which provide a realistic look of the heritage of farming.

So which came first – the chicken or the egg? Find out this answer and more when you visit the Poultry Museum which showcases the evolution of the industry.
