From a 2000 year-old Kansas City Hopwell culture, a 300 year old dug-out canoe to a 1903 Metropolitan horse-drawn steam pumper fire engine, the Wyandotte County Historical Museum helps preserve the history of Wyandotte County, from marriages, deaths, life and times; through newspapers, city directories and photographs in several libraries and galleries. The Wyandotte County Historical Museum was opened June 10, 1956. An effort by the Wyandotte County Historical Society and Museum was started to collect artifacts and to commence a resource library for a new museum facility. In December 1962, the Society broke ground, at its present site, for the first stage of a museum. In 1967, the Museum was opened to the public in the Wyandotte County Park in Bonner Springs, Kansas. The Museum houses the Trowbridge Research Library, Trowbridge/Barker Gallery, the East Gallery and auditorium.
