	Mostly flat family bike ride McDade miles 0-5.2 Summer weekend bike rentals at Smithfield	Hialeah Picnic Area north to Turn Farm Spur (0.3 miles/0.5 km spur)	Up to 10.4 miles/16.7 km (plus spur)	Smithfield northbound has flat, sunny fields; Smithfield southbound has shade but a steep hill at Hialeah. Pets not allowed to stay at Milford Beach. or to come within 0.25 miles of Smithfield Beach in summer. Fee to park at Smithfield in season.
	History hiking: old roads, barns, and houses * McDade miles 5.2-8.4	Turn Farm Spur north to Bushkill Village (No trail bridge over Bushkill Creek)	Up to 6.4 miles/10.3 km	Shady section filled with history best explored on foot. Steep switch-backs up to the boardwalk over the swamp (walk bikes), then rolling trail. Side trip: Springhouse on Freeman Tract Road 0.1 mile northeast of Owens Trailhead. Headquarters is open 8:00-4:30 Monday to Friday.

	Flat strolls or short rides McDade miles 12.4-16.1	Egypt Mills (on US 209); Eshback Access; Jerry Lees Access	Up to 7.2 miles /11.6 km	Shady walk or ride along Toms Creek; river view and half-mile shady walk south at Eshback; wildflowers and a spruce plantation south of Jerry Lees. Good view west to the Pocono ridge.
	Long bike ride with streams, forest, small hills McDade miles 8.4-20.9	Bushkill Village north to Schneider Farm Spur (0.4-mile/0.7 km spur)	Up to 25 miles/ 40.2 km (plus spur)	Combines above sections for a long, flat and sunny ride with some dips at stream crossings and some hills around mile 17. Fine view south over fields and wetlands from 0.5 mile spur road to/from Schneider Farm Trailhead.
	Dingmans Creek Area McDade miles 20.9-24.5	Schneider Farm Spur north to White Pines	Up to 9 miles/ 14.5 km	A closer look at Dingmans Creek as it threads under Rt. 739 and flows into the Delaware River. Steep, shady switchbacks. Store (food, drinks) but no trailhead parking at Dingmans Campground.

	Views of Raymondskill Cliff McDade miles 28.7-31.0	Pittman Orchard north to Milford Beach (No trailheads in between)	4.6 miles/ 7.4 km	Fine views of the cliffs 500 ft above the valley floor and Milford-Montague bridge; wildflowers and butterflies in unused fields; Milford-Montague bridge. Side trip: north bank of the Raymondskill (no trail bridge) is 0.5 miles south of Pittman. Pets not allowed to stay at Milford Beach in summer. Fee to park at Milford Beach in season.
