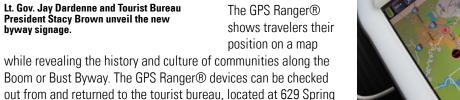

DigiFest South to showcase fast-growing industry

Shreveport-Bossier is known for its music, arts and food, but unbeknownst to some. the area also became known as a hotbed for something else – digital media jobs. Last year, Forbes Magazine named Shreveport-Bossier No. 3 among the top cities for information jobs in the country, beating out locales like San Jose-Sunnyvale-Santa Clara, Calif., Grand Rapids-Wyoming, Mich. and Madison, Wis.

Information jobs include everything from media and data processing to Internet-related businesses and the Bossier Arts Council is hoping to bring more awareness to this fast-growing industry with its upcoming DigiFest South 2012. The three-day event, set for Sept. 7-9 at the Bossier Civic Center, will feature several parts, including a digital arts exhibition, a series of TEDx Red River presentations and a technology career fair with recruiters from area, regional and statewide tech-based companies.

For organizer Clint McCommon, the idea was a no-brainer. "From entertainment to the movie industry, to companies like (Academy Awardwinning Moonbot Studios) and Twin Engine Labs, there's a lot of tech-based infrastructure

here. It's like a hidden gem," McCommon said. Other participants will include the Cyber In-

novation Center, Cohabitat, Blade Studios, Fairfield Studios, Millennium Studios, Worldwide FX and more. DigiFest South will both exhibit and provide opportunities for those with skill sets that range from 3D design and animation, digital sculpture and robotics, graphic design and motion graphics to digital photography, digital video and film, CG animation, mechanical and architectural design and digital sound and

Hosting sporting events like the USA National University Weightlifting Championships and the 2009 and 2012 Bassmaster Classics puts Shreveport-Bossier on the national sports map. Building and maintaining that status is what keeps the Shreveport-Bossier Sports Commission hard at work, and it seems the elbow grease is paying off in the form of repeat events and new, exciting match ups.

Two recent bid wins include the LHSAA Boys' and Girls' State Golf Tournament for 2013 and 2014 and the USA Wakeboard Regional Qualifier 2012. By hosting the wakeboard qualifying event, sports commission representatives hope to bring the national event to Shreveport-Bossier in 2013.

Fall football is another one of the area's

strong suits, and 2012 is full of gridiron activity. A new matchup between Texas A&M University and Louisiana Tech is slated for Aug. 30, and it's expected to draw big crowds to Shreveport-Bossier. The Port City Classic, Sept. 1, featuring Grambling State University and Alcorn State and the Landers Dodge Battle on the Border featuring high school powerhouse teams. Sept. 8, return to kick things off early in September. Then Prairie View A&M University and Southern University meet up again, Oct. 27, in the Shreveport Classic.

New tournaments, spectator sports and indoor competitions are all included on a long list of events that the sports commission is working on to bring to the area.

"Sport planners are attracted to Shreveport-
